

The Water-Energy-Food Security Nexus Approach



- Highlights the complex interdependencies of the water, energy and food sectors in light of global challenges (climate change, consumption patterns, economic growth, rapid urbanization, etc.)
- Framework to determine trade-offs and synergies
 between the sectors and to reconcile their interests
- Supports a holistic and sustainable resources management and promotes the preservation of ecosystems
- Pathways of sustainability: tool for meeting the SDGs
- Resolving conflicts of use around land and water resources is encouraged by developing suitable conflict management capacities – contributes to peace keeping

Nexus Projects

In practice it is currently rather unusual that concrete "Nexus projects" are proposed to donors.

Sometimes "Nexus" is only used as label to sell conventional projects.

But:

Many projects have excellent Nexus potential and will reach more and better impact as intersectorial initiatives and will also use the available financial resources more efficiently.

- Hint 1: The project is proposed not only by one sector.
 - It is clear from the documentation that 2 or more sectors are presenting the project together to the donor.
 - Support letters or other documentation of agreement is provided or
 - The project is proposed by an overarching entity or multisectoral institution (Example: Ministry of Planning, Ministry of Finance, Office of the President, RECs, sometimes also RBOs)

- Hint 2: It is visible in the documentation that initial coordination activities between the sectors have been carried out during project idea/concept development
 - Input for the project comes from two or more sectors
 - Content and planning of proposed activities relates to two or more sectors

- Hint 3: The project proposal shows that the needs and demands of the relevant sectors have been/will be discussed with all stakeholders and/or are considered in the proposal.
 - IMPORTANT: If a sector is relevant or not should not be determined by the lead sector, rather by the affected sector itself.
 - Very inclusive approach needs to be included/described in the project documentation.

- Hint 4: Effects on/Synergies with other sectors (which are not directly in the focus of the intervention) are considered/ will be evaluated/are described
 - Inclusive planning and involvement is key part of the proposal
 - Intersectoral thinking is applied

- Hint 5: Approach for the proposed intervention is intersectorial and covers the entire "lifespan"
 - Design/Planning, Implementation and Operation are proposed in an intersectorial way or
 - Through suitable overarching entities
 - Existing/future mandate of the entities is described

- Hint 6: The project will deliver results in different sectors
 - It is described and quantified what the project will reach in which sectors
 - Direct and indirect results can be considered
 - Intersectorial indicators are proposed or a good set of sectorial indicators are matched
 - The project delivers a contribution to reach several SDGs (crucial: SDG 2, 6 and 7 - but also beyond)

What to do if the project does not meet Nexus criteria?

- Project does not meet the criteria listed before, but has potential to involve other sectors
 - Project scope of work and scale is relevant for other sectors and affects them
 - Financing can be used to guide development into an intersectorial direction
 - Ideally intersectorial projects would have an advantage for/priority for receiving financing
 - Pre-condition for financing?
 - Project developers/implementers will adapt quickly ©

Nexus Projects

- These initial criteria can be applied for the set-up of new projects as well as the evaluation of existing projects.
- They can also help to guide project proponents to include a more intersectorial approach in their proposals before acceptance through a donor or financing institution.
