

The Nexus Regional Dialogues Programme since 2016

Objective is to introduce water-energy-food (WEF) approach at the institutional level through development of concrete policy recommendations and action plans for future activities globally. The programme is co-funded by the European Union and the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development.

Phase I: Nexus Dialogue in Central Asia

Objective: To create a multi-sectoral enabling environment to facilitate sustainable investments for increased water, energy, food security and ecosystems in Central Asia.





Total budget: €1.52 mln (€1.3 mln EU grant + €0.22 mln CAREC)



Implementers: CAREC – coordinator; IUCA – international expertise, EC IFAS



National partners: *Ministries of energy and water resources, economy, agriculture and environment, and state affiliated entities*



Partners: GIZ IWRMCA, USAID Smart Waters, WB CAMP4ASB

Phase I: Achievements

WEF Nexus regionally integrated:

- All five countries expressed their interest in the Project;
- Nexus concept integrated into the ASBP-4 project pipeline and REP4SD of CA;
- Investment portfolio of WEF Nexus Project developed and officially supported.

Practical Application:

- 4 small-scale Nexus pilot project implemented in KZ, TJ, TM and UZ;
- 9 pilot territories are proposed for Phase II.

Technical Assistance:

- 10 Expert reports, reviews and publications;
- Study tour to Danube and Sava River Basins;
- Project shorthand.

Nexus Awareness Raising:

- About 3000 participants around the world;
- About 40 events organized and supported directly affecting nearly 450 participants in CA (64% males and 36% females);
 - In total, 71 presentations made at the regional and international events.



Phase II: Nexus Dialogue in Central Asia

Objective: Practical application of Nexus tools, methods and techniques through implementation of WEF Nexus pilot projects and leverage increased benefits and decreased trade-offs of cooperation at the regional level.





Total budget: €1.25 mln (€1 mln EU grant + €0.25 mln CAREC)



Implementers: CAREC – coordinator.



National partners: Ministries of energy, water resources, economy, agriculture and environment, state affiliated entities, educational facilities and academia



Partners: World Bank Group

Phase II: Focus Areas

Based on the voiced needs on: i) implementation of joint (transboundary) Nexus projects; ii) identification of adequate financing mechanisms for the multilateral Nexus projects; iii) development of institutional frameworks, and iv) well-structured capacity building interventions to cultivate WEF Nexus thinking among the expert community.






